

# Custom Borders from Point to Point Patterns

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Point to Point patterns that are drawn as triangles can be used to create custom borders, with all of these advantages:

The repeated pattern is easy to place using P2P function

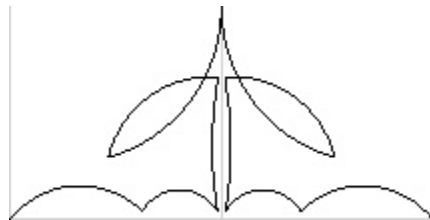
P2P patterns are a perfect fit, even when the piecing is not perfect

Use a single or double pattern, for desired density

Triangle patterns automatically make a mitered corner

Easily create a custom Border/Corner look with a single pattern

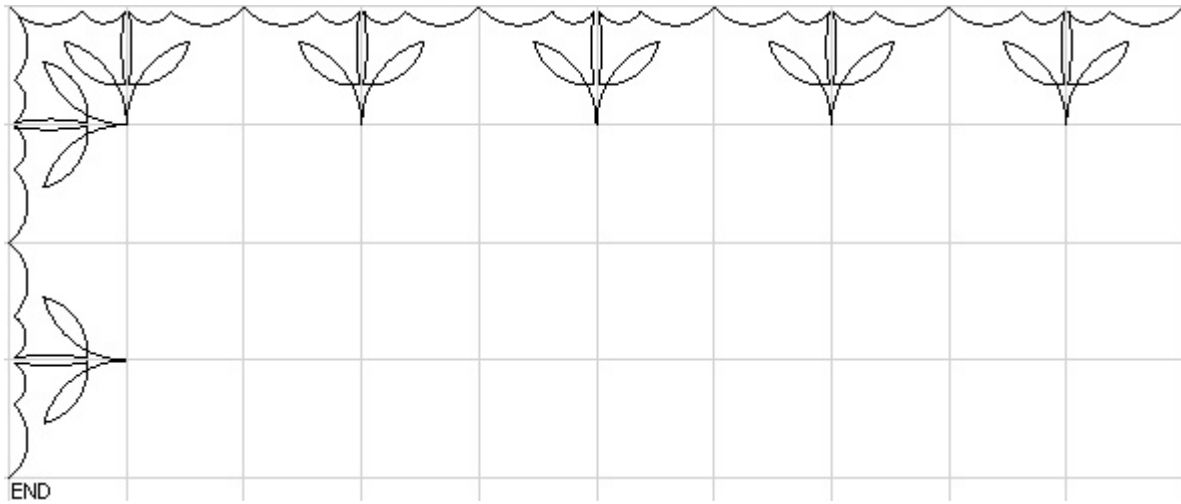
1. Choose a P2P Triangle pattern with a base that is twice the height. This pattern is called Sew Simple.



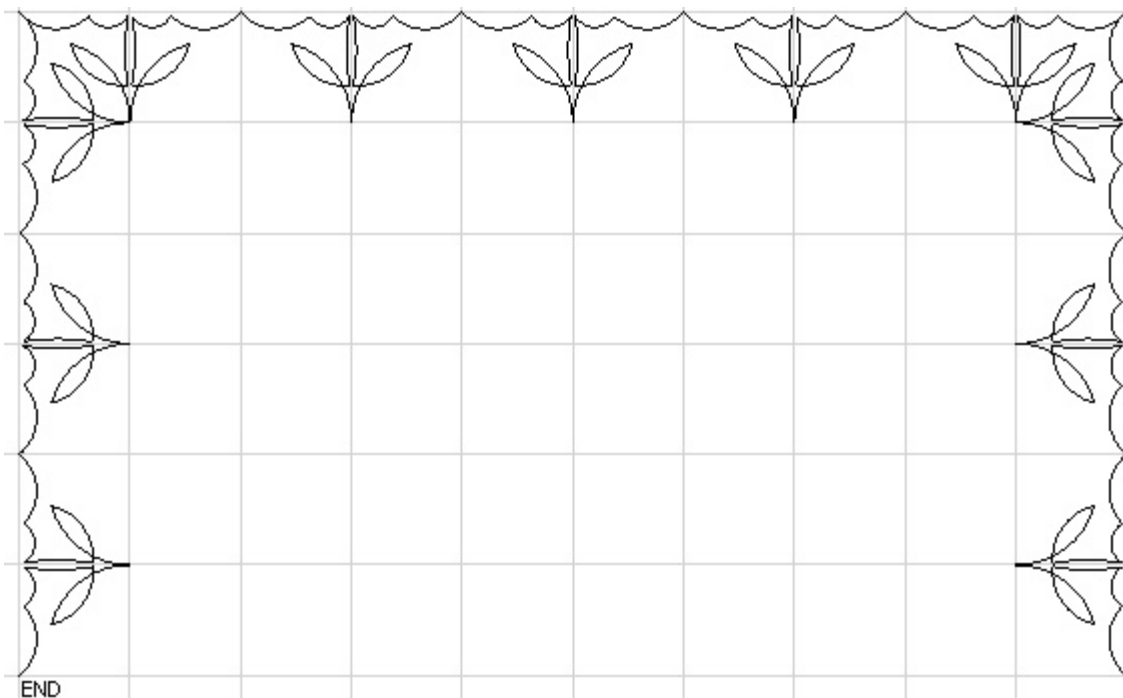
2. Select the P2P Pattern function on the toolbar and click along the edge of the border seamline. Measure the length of the border to determine even spacing, or use patchwork seams as clicking points. When placing a P2P pattern along a top border, work from R to L.



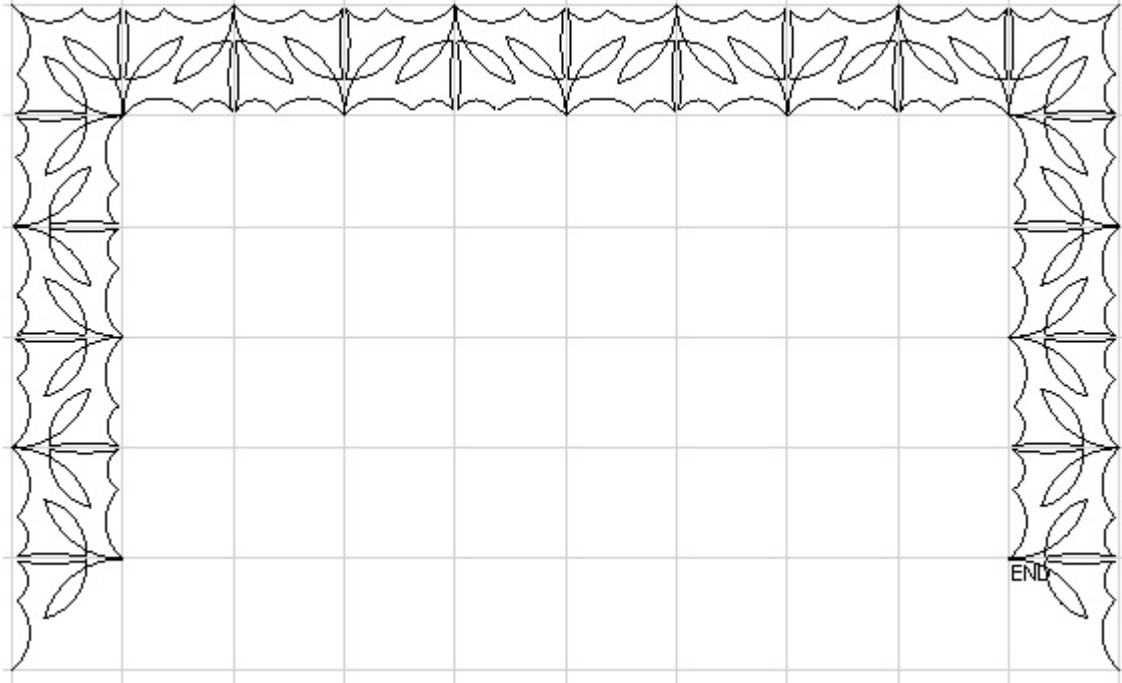
3. When you turn the corner, the pattern creates a perfect miter.



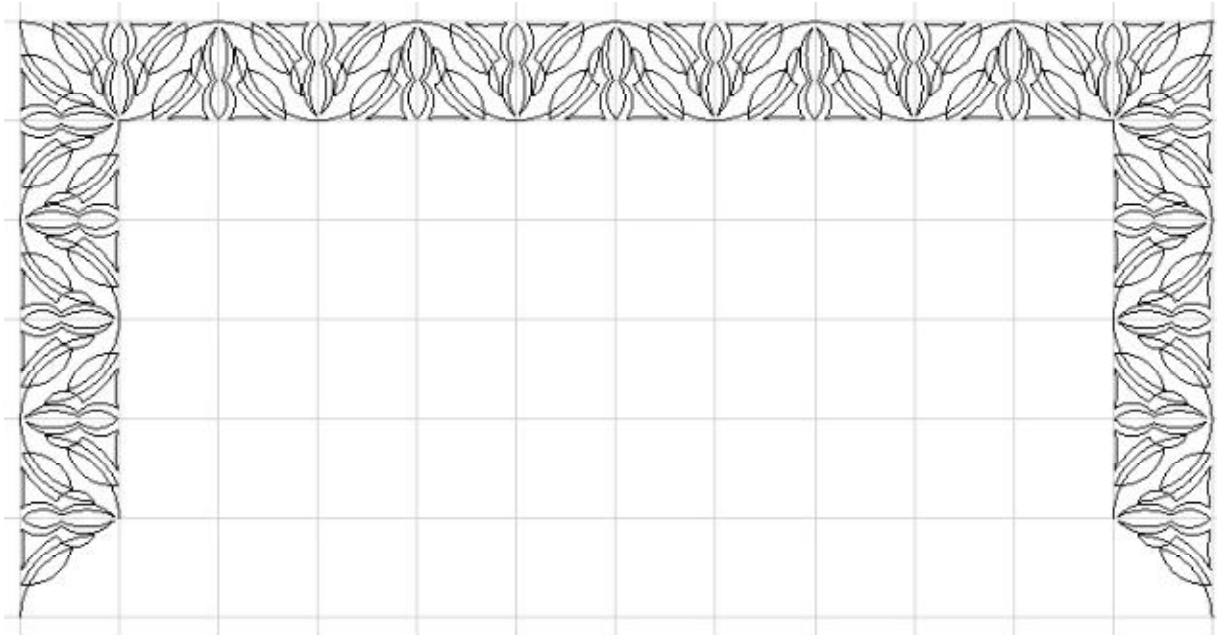
4. When setting up the actual quilt, you will want to place the pattern for as much of the border as you can stitch at one time. With a P2P pattern, all three sides will quilt in a continuous pattern with no tie-offs.



5. If you want the quilting to be more dense, simply repeat the design in the opposite direction, so that the point of each triangle pattern falls in between the others.
